On 18<sup>th</sup>, we started the week by putting up the posters and slogans at the entrance to our OPDs and AMCHSS, for the public at large to read and understand. Some posters were for the contest and others were willingly contributed for display by our supporters.



On 19<sup>th</sup>, we teamed up with the Public Health wing to present a skit just after the presentation for Academic Fest, to the ready audience available there. Though there was no time for rehearsals, the busy MPH students managed to convey the gist of preventing AMR by one Health, to the audience






On 19<sup>th</sup>, there was a training programme for Link nurses, from 9am to 4pm. The resource persons were Dr.Aravind R, ID consultant — GMC, Trivandrum, Dr. Dinoop KP, Associate Professor of Microbiology, Ms Preethamol, ICN and Ms\_Anasooya, Associate nursing Superintendent.



On 21<sup>st</sup> we had one webinar on HBV diagnosis and other on the role of Procalcitonin detection in sepsis. The star webinar was the talk by Dr.Victor <u>D.</u> Rosenthal, Infectious Disease specialist and Research Professor at the University of Miami, who is the founder of the International Infection Control Consortium that is engaged in generating data on HCAI from the developing countries and in creating a benchmark for them. He spoke on SSI prevention, based on evidence gathered from his studies and meta analysis of several studies from all over the world. His presentation was short and to the point. The audience of microbiologists, ID specialists, surgeons, physicians, nurses and others from all over India learnt a great deal from his words and the Q&A session was marked by very many interesting





On 22<sup>nd</sup> Nov was a panel discussion, perhaps the first of its kind in this Institution where we brought together experts from the Medical, Veterinary and Fisheries Universities to debate on what can be done to combat AMR that has now become a fact of life not only for humans but for the animal, poultry and fishing industry. Dr. Aravind R, Convener of KARSAP, Dr. Swapna Susan Nodal Officer for KARSAP in the Veterinary side, Dr.Devika Pillai from KUFOS and Dr.Surya Shankar, vet surgeon from Veterinary College, Mannuthy had an interesting and in-depth discussion on the problems faced.



On 23<sup>rd</sup> Nov we had a webinar on the latest updates in AMSP by Dr.Anup Warrier where he described the change in policy from mandatory orders by AMSP team to open discussions on managing individual patients between clinicians and the AMSP team. Audit of the compliance to advice from AMSP team and outcome of the patient would then be analysed and presented at the audit meetings.

On 24<sup>th</sup> November , was the Valedictory function and installation of the Antimicrobial stewardship Team. Dr.Sanjay Behari,Director, SCTIMST presided over the function. Dr.Kavita Raja delivered the report of the week long observance of antimicrobial awareness based on the theme prescribed by WHO. She also delivered a keynote address on the proposed AMSP team and their objective to make the hospital free of Multi drug resistant organisms(MDROs), by developing an antibiotic policyacceptable to all. The Director in his presidential address informed the audience that the initiative

of developing an antibiotic policy was his directive to the team. He wanted the team to quickly develop and implement the antibiotic policy with review meetings every three months.
